Dear Rep. Bass,

Thank you for your work to take input from Members regarding potential changes to our Caucus Rules. I appreciate the work you are doing to ensure that our Caucus is well run, effective, and provides opportunities for every Member to contribute towards our shared goals.

I have only served one full term, but in that time I have observed that some of our newer members have incredible energy, dedication to public service, and an interest in playing a more active role in helping our Caucus. Below are some ideas that I believe would help harness that energy that would benefit all of our Members:

- Vice-Chairs and Vice-Ranking Members: Each Committee should elect a member to serve as Vice-Chair or Vice-Ranking Member. The individual chosen should be in his or her first or second term serving on the Committee, and the position should be term limited to a single term.
  - o Portfolio: The Vice-Chair or Vice-Ranking Member should be given particular responsibility for member services, messaging, and outreach.
  - O Staff: The position should come with some staff resources, to ensure that the Vice-Chair or Vice-Ranking Member has the ability to execute his or her responsibilities.
  - Weekly Chair/Ranking Member Meeting: The Vice-Chair or Vice-Ranking Member should be invited to attend weekly meetings with leadership to ensure junior members have a full understanding of legislation coming to the floor and an opportunity to provide their views.
- Leadership Meetings: There are currently no rules dictating when leadership meets, what their agenda is, and who is invited.
  - o Formalized Meetings: Caucus Rules should be amended to formalize weekly leadership meetings to discuss floor activity, messaging, and other issues.
  - o Attendees: The elected Freshman Class President should be invited to attend each weekly meeting, as well as two other members of the caucus on a rotating basis.
